

In anticipation of the upcoming Winter, we are installing a new litter fence around the top of Cells 5 and 6. As any of the drivers can attest to, dumping a load on the top of the landfill is much different than dumping a load at the bottom of the landfill. The wind on top can make it very difficult to dump. Pioneer Crossing takes every step possible to stay open during a "wind event", even as other landfills are closing. There are some loads that will be impossible to dump during a "wind event" and an email will be sent out the night before or early in the morning as to which loads we will not accept. Pioneer thanks the divisions in advance for complying with this policy. We have a new "Odor Control" vehicle at the landfill. It's a large, articulated, all wheel drive truck with a very large tank. No longer will our employee have to climb out on top of the truck to spray deodorant. You can work this one from inside the cab. I'm sure Randy will be very happy about that! We are actively checking that everyone on the disposal site is wearing their safety vest. If a safety vest or shirt is not worn, you will not be allowed on the disposal site, so make sure you have one before you go up. It's for your safety! Have a great Thanksgiving Holiday!
