Pioneer Crossing Landfill



His duties were to maintain a clean work area so the fork truck could access bales of trash coming out of a baler. The fork truck would then load the bales onto trucks and transport to landfills. Within several months Joe was operating the fork truck as well as performing the general laborer duties. In his second year of employment Joe learned to operate the trash baler and became an operator who had very good production numbers. In no time he was also trained in the baler strapper maintenance and fundamental hydraulic repairs. Joe served us at Lehigh Valley Recycling in this capacity for a number of years. After the loss of the City of Allentown collection contract, Joe was trained to operate a rubber tire loader and also trained in operating yard trucks utilized in the preloading of open top walking floor trailers. Joe worked on yard trucks, trailers and anything that needed to be repaired. If we didn't have the part to fix it Joe would figure something out until we got the part.
